

- Seminars are back again. WBC offers a variety of talks in the Hopewell room hosted by hobby experts.
- Open Gaming space has been expanded to ballroom dimensions in 2009 to ensure plenty of non-tournament gaming throughout the week.

WBC GAME AUCTION: On Tuesday, from 10 AM to 5 PM, WBC will host its 6th annual Game Auction for the sale of board and card games, and accessories pertaining to same. Pre-registration of items for sale is required by July 25th. Preregistered items with lot slips may be delivered between 8 & 10 PM, Monday, August 3rd and 8 AM till noon on Tuesday, August 4th. Full details pertaining to the Auction are available at boardgamers.org/wbc/auction.htm. It will be updated weekly with a list of pre-registered items for sale. Plan to come early to enjoy the auction, content in the knowledge that you won't be missing any other events, while you look for that long out-of-print classic that has been eluding you for years.

ADMISSION: BPA membership is included in the price of admission unless using a one-day guest pass. Spectators are admitted free to patronize vendors, but both Open Gaming and events are limited to BPA members or guests with a valid WBC badge for that day. Children 12 and under accompanied by a member may participate in free "Juniors-only" tournaments by signing parental consent forms in the Heritage room. There are no event fees. Pre-cons require separate admission for non-Tribune level members. Flea markets, product displays and the selling or promotion of any item on the premises is prohibited to all except authorized vendors.

EVENTS: There is no event pre-registration. You may participate in as many events as you like, but only one at a time. Please inform the GM when dropping out of an event. To guarantee inclusion, bring the game (to ensure sufficient copies) and be present at the start. Wear your badge



at all times. To confirm your registration status for WBC and/or its Pre-Cons, or to seek carpool, roommate, Open Gaming matches or teammates, check boardgamers.org/wbc/prereg.htm. See our detailed website for schedule, prize and format details pertaining to each event.

PRIZES: Century events offer a Centurion shirt to the winner and two to six BPA plaques as listed in the program, depending on prior year event participation. Trial and Junior events receive one plaque. Some events also award publisher merchandise credits or donated items. See each event's detailed web preview at boardgamers. org/yearbkex for details.

<u>CLASS</u>: All WBC events are color coded throughout our website and event kiosk presentations for required experience levels.

# A (Red): Advanced players only. Rules are not explained.

B (Yellow): Beginners welcome. Rules are taught only at the scheduled teaching demonstration in Paradise Terrace – the GM does not teach during the event.

## C (Green): Coached. Beginners will be taught during play of the event.

JUNIORS EVENTS: Children who are 12 and under, able to read and accompanied by an adult member may participate for free in 20 Juniors events and Open Gaming. See boardgamers.org/yearb-kex/jnrpge.htm.

LANCASTER HOST: There are many amenities at the recently refurbished Lancaster Host. Among them are • being within one mile of 200 outlet stores • a weekend comedy club • practically "next door" to Dutch Wonderland • within one hour of Hershey Park & Gettysburg • indoor and outdoor pools, jacuzzi & kiddie pool • 18-hole golf course • driving range • mini-golf • putting green • 1.9 mile jogging trail • game room • stables • tour cart rentals • ping pong & pool

tables • tennis & volleyball courts • bicycle rental • shuffle board • children's playground • numerous local attractions and fine restaurants. Lancaster Host is already sold out for WBC week, but because cancellations do occur, you may wish to inquire anyway. The WBC Room rate at the Host is \$99 per day for one to four guests per room. Applicable state taxes bring that to \$109.89. A check or money order covering the first night's stay or submission of the entire number of your major credit card including expiration date and signature is required to make a reservation. Reservations must be secured in this manner. Guests who cancel reservations within 30 days of the reserved arrival date forfeit the room deposit. Specify any other guests with whom you will share the room at the time of your reservation. Contact: Lancaster Host, 2300 Lincoln Highway East, Lancaster, PA 17602 or call the hotel at 717-299-5500 weekdays between 8 AM and 7 PM EST.

RECOMMENDED HOTELS: Fortunately, there are many hotels within easy walking distance, although sellouts are common at this time of year so make your reservations as early as possible. We recommend both the Continental and Red Roof Inns as the best combination of quality, convenience, and value. We have roomblocks at both hotels with discounted rates for those attending WBC, but only if you book early and correctly identify your attendance at WBC. These hotels may already be sold out unless you identify your affiliation with our roomblock. The good news is that the cancellation policies are much more lenient than those at the Host and the values are better. The bad news is that while the walk to the Host is short, it does cross a busy highway. In both cases, be sure to identify yourself as with the BPA's World Boardgaming Championships both to get our special group rate and credit us with your stay (thereby reducing your costs).

• Continental Inn: The Continental Inn is directly across the street from the Host. The amenities include indoor and outdoor pools and jacuzzi, cable tv, free wireless internet, refrigerators, coffee makers, and more. A complete, complimentary hot breakfast is included to start your day. The special WBC rate is \$94 per day plus 11% tax per single thru quad occupancy with one King or two Double Beds. Rollaway beds, if requested, are \$7 additional.

Deposit: A three-night minimum stay is required for this special group rate. One night's deposit will be required upon booking. Deposit is refundable up until 48 hours prior to arrival. Phone 717-299-0421 to make your reservation or email info@continentallnn.com for a callback by the reservationist. Alternatively, you may book on line at continentalinn.com at the regular rates and identify yourself in the comments as claiming the WBC rate providing you are booking the three-night minimum stay. This offer is valid until July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2009, or our room block sells out, whichever occurs first.

• Red Roof Inn: The recently renovated Red Roof Inn is across the street and a short walk away from the Host, next to some excellent restaurants. The amenities include an outdoor pool, a free Deluxe Continental breakfast, complimentary USA Today newspaper, free local phone calls, wireless internet, and voicemail, Cable TV with HBO, microwave and mini-fridge in every room, and discounts at the aforementioned restaurants. The special WBC rate is \$89.99 per night plus 11% tax per single thru quad occuancy with one King or two Double Beds.

Deposit: There is no deposit required but the reservation must be confirmed with a valid credit card. Cancellations must be received at least 24 hours in advance. Cancellations less than 14 days prior to arrival will automatically result in payment of the entire first night's room and tax for all rooms cancelled. Call 866-225-2066 toll free to make your reservation. This offer is valid until July 18th, 2009, or our roomblock sells out, whichever occurs first.

To check other local vacancies, call 866-220-8985 and inquire for lodging near Lancaster Host.

TOURNAMENTS: WBC features competition in 107 Century tournaments with varying formats, prizes and starting times. Details on each event are listed at boardgamers.org/yearbkex and a very helpful personal scheduling tool is located at boardgamers.org/wbc/sviewer/. Supplementing these old favorites are dozens of additional events selected by the membership or sponsored by publishers or patrons. Descriptions of these events can be found on the web also. New events for 2009 include: Battle; Napoleonic Wars, Chicago Express, Conflict of Heroes, Dominion, Eisenbach Gap, Kutuzov, Pursuit of Glory, Royal Palace, Stone Age, Storm Over Stalingrad and Warriors of

God. Players need not complete the entire tournamnt and are encouraged to drop in for friendly games so long as they inform the GM when they withdraw from further play.

2008/09 YEARBOOKS: The WBC full color Yearbooks will not be available to all attendees. Instead, attendees will receive a smaller, simpler program at registration dealing only with the schedule. The Yearbook covering the 2008 WBC results and early 2009 mini-cons and PBeM events will be mailed with this pre-reg form to all members of Sustaining level or higher as of January 1st, 2009 (one per family). Also receiving Yearbooks with this mailing will be current Tribune members and those paying the extra \$10 cost by the date of this mailing. All others entitled to Yearbooks (paid family members by the required deadline) and those purchasing them after this mailing may receive them at WBC registration in the New Holland room during WBC while supplies last. An electronic ballot is posted at boardgamers.org/forms/boardballot.shtml. You may vote for up to three candidates, but no more than once per candidate. Votes will be recorded in accordance with membership level. A member whose membership status is entitled to multiple votes should submit only one ballot - the votes thereon will be weighted appropriately by election officials. Note that any multi-day attendee at WBC is considered a BPA member and is entitled to vote if they have pre-paid their admission by July 15th, 2009.
