- A nightly teen event ends each evening with a safe and focused social opportunity for the younger set.

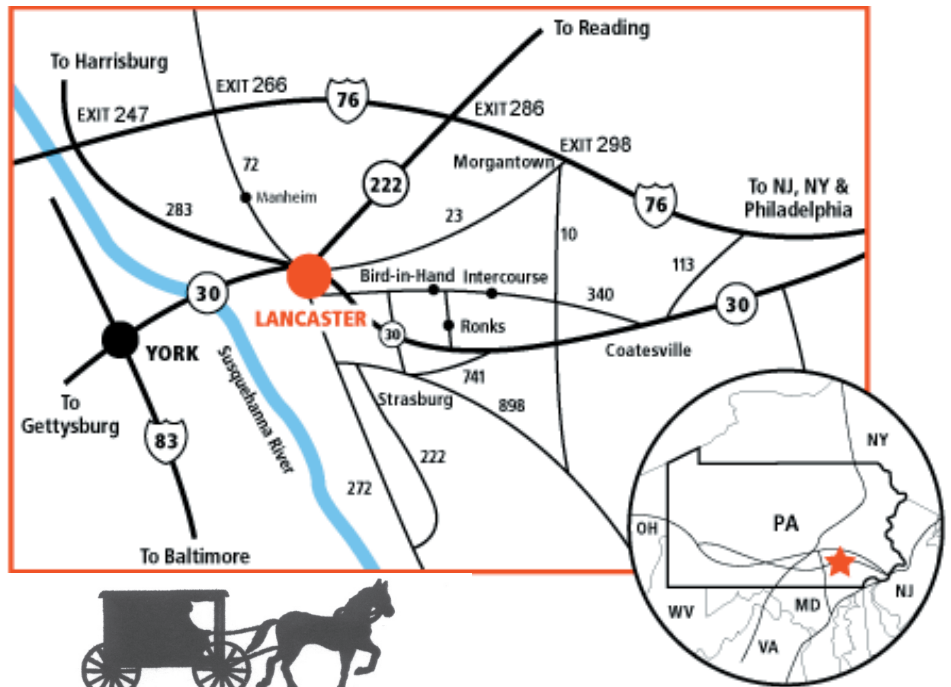

- WBC is now six full days of round-the-clock gaming from 9 AM Tuesday thru 6 PM Sunday with the addition of Open Gaming starting Tuesday morning in Wheatland. With this extra time we will host the fourth ...

WBC GAME AUCTION: On Tuesday, from 10 AM to 5 PM, WBC will host its Game Auction for the sale of boardgames, card games, and accessories pertaining to same. Registration for the Auction will be held between 8 & 10 PM, Monday, and 8 AM till noon on Tuesday, July 31st. However, pre-registration of items for sale is highly recommended as the available auction slots always sell out. Full details pertaining to the Auction are available on page 89 of your program and on www.boardgamers.org/wbc/auction.htm. It will be updated weekly with a list of pre-registered items for sale. Plan to come early to enjoy the auction, content in the knowledge that you won't be missing any other events, while you look for that long out-of-print classic that has been eluding you for years.

ADMISSION: BPA membership is included in the price of admission unless using a one-day guest pass. Spectators are admitted free to patronize vendors, but Open Gaming and all events are limited to BPA members or guests with a valid WBC badge. Children 12 and under accompanied by a member may participate in free "Juniors-only" tournaments. There are no event fees other than those required for Pre-cons. Flea markets, product displays and the selling or promotion of any item on the premises is prohibited to all except authorized vendors.

EVENTS: There is no pre-registration for events. You may participate in as many events as you like, but only one at a time. To guarantee inclusion, bring the game (to ensure sufficient copies) and be on time. Wear your badge at all times. To confirm your registration status for WBC and the Pre-Cons, or to seek carpool, roommates, Open Gaming matches or teammates check www.boardgamers.org/wbc/prereg.htm. PRIZES: Tournament prizes consist of BPA plaques. Century event prizes include a Century shirt and two to six such plaques based on prior year event player hours. Trial and Junior events receive one such plaque. Prizes of some events are supplemented by merchandise credits from the publisher or items donated by the GM. CLASS: All WBC events are color coded throughout our website, program, and event kiosk presentations for required experience levels. **A (Red):** Advanced players only. Rules are not explained. **B (Yellow):** Beginners welcome. Rules are taught only at the scheduled teaching demonstration in Paradise Terrace - the GM does not teach during the event. **C (Green):** Coached. Beginners will be taught during play of the event.

JUNIOR EVENTS: Children who are 12 and under, able to read and accompanied by an adult member may participate for free in 20 Juniors events and Open Gaming. See www.boardgamers.org/yearbkex/jnrpg.htm.

HOTEL: The WBC Room rate is \$94 per day for one-to-four guests per room. Applicable state taxes bring that total to \$98.79. A check or money order covering the first night's stay, or

submission of the entire number of your major credit card including expiration date and signature is required to make a reservation. No reservation will be accepted unless secured in this manner. Guests who cancel reservations within 30 days of the reserved arrival date, forfeit the room deposit. Specify any other guests with whom you will share the room at the time of your reservation. However, cancellations do occur and you may wish to check with Host anyway. We have established a roomblock with matching discounted rates at the Continental which is just across the street.
